Indigestible correctness

From April 9 - May 9, 2004, PARTICIPANT INC will present *Indigestible Correctness*. Inspired by surrealist texts and actions, Rita Ackermann and Lizzi Bougatsos have assembled the exhibition project, *Indigestible Correctness*. Occurring in two venues simultaneously (PARTICIPANT INC and Kenny Schachter/ROVE), the exhibition comprises an intergenerational group of artists whose works manifest the dualism of urgency and fragility, stylistically characterized by aggression and throwaway elegance--terms the curators use to describe their overall aesthetic interests. Including pioneers of personal nonconformity who have inspired movements, the exhibition deploys non-iconic works by well-known artists along with challenging works by a new generation, uniting to propose a prototype for a utopia that doesn't exist.

Indigestible Correctness seeks to create a platform in which aesthetic affinities traverse genealogical hierarchies and social status, establishing a common denominator that brings together the acclaimed and the emerging, the introspective and the social. Working collaboratively on performance and installation-based work (as members of Angelblood), Ackermann and Bougatsos integrate their own disruptive practice into a curatorial strategy, placing together critical, conceptual and expressive works in an emerging exhibition context. Indigestible Correctness establishes a disharmonious common ground in which artists' works can interact, and aesthetic relationships break with authoritative structures of categorization and standards.

Rita Ackermann is a Hungarian-born artist and gypsy singer in the Transylvanian spirit. Represented by Andrea Rosen Gallery in New York City, her paintings show worldwide. Previous sound recordings appear under various guises on labels in America and Japan.

Lizzi Bougatsos is an artist and musician, performing in bands including Russia (1997) and Gang Gang Dance (present). Prior to 1999, she held Warhol-like screenings in her apartment with others from the legendary band Actress. Angelblood formed in 1999 and released its first EP, and in 2001 released *Mass for the Daggers. Labia Minora* is the group's third album aside from bootlegs burned for the tour.

Ackermann and Bougatsos curated "The Human Face is an Empty Force, a Field of Death," (2004) at Annet Gelink Gallery, Amsterdam. Together with Jess Holzworth and Chloe Sevigny, Ackermann and Bougatsos curated "Violence the true way" (2002) at Galerie Peter Kilchmann, Zurich. Angelblood has exhibited Angelblood Tour Works 01-03 at Printed Matter, New York (2004); in Anti-Pure at Ursula Blickle Stiftung, Kraichtal, Germany and Kunsthalle, St. Gallen, Switzerland (2003). They performed at All Tomorrow's Parties, Campher Sands, England; the Impact Festival: Art, Music & Politics. Utrecht, Holland; and at the Purple Institute, Paris, France.
